FOR ACADEMIC YEAR 2022-23

National Health Policy 2017 document emphasized the need for preparation of nurse practitioners/Specialist nurses, standardization of education and clinical training and strengthening regulation of nursing practice. In response to this. Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) - Competency – based and clinical residency – based curriculum for Nurse practitioner programs has been developed by Indian Nursing Council.

Scope:

DNP graduate will be able to

Practice as advanced practice nurse (NPCC) with higher level competencies.

Assume clinical leadership positions (Quality Improvement, Leadership and Policy)

Assume faculty positions in teaching nurse practitioner/specialty nursing programme.

Assume dual role leadership positions at integration of education and practice settings.

Conduct Evidence based practice (EBP) projects to apply evidence for advanced practice nursing.

Number of Seats – 6

Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP) is one of the terminal degrees in nursing that prepares graduates for the highest level of clinical practice and leadership role in the discipline.

DNP (Critical care) is a Doctorate in Nursing Practice for Nurse Practitioner critical care (NPCC) graduates.

DNP is a practice Intensive degree whereas PhD is a research Intensive degree.

Duration:

DNP (Critical Care) is a three years, maximum of 6 years full time/ part time Doctorate in Nursing Practice for Nurse Practitioner Critical Care (NPCC) graduates.

Eligibility: Applications are invited from eligible scholars who

- (a) Have obtained a Post graduate degree in Nursing (NPCC) recognized by Council with 2 years of Critical care Clinical experience for enrolment in DNP Critical Care (Part time) under faculty of Nursing in the respective University.
- (b) Have passed M. Sc. Nursing (NPCC) with a minimum of 60 marks for every course/subject.
- (c) Are working in specialty Hospital/Specialty unit/Department (Critical Care Unit) within the College of Nursing /University jurisdiction.

Criteria for Selection:

- (a) Merit in the Based on M. Sc. (NPCC) examination marks – Minimum 60%
