Medical students must find a way to attend classes, study, and attend to their normal life activities. If you do not have a plan to get all your tasks completed, you will be overworked, frustrated, and stressed. However, if you learn to manage your time you will be much happier.

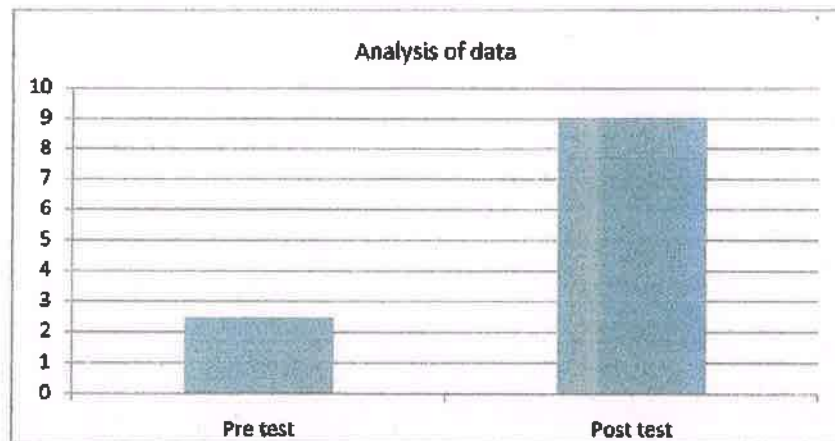
Speaker explained a centralized location for time study schedule. May prefer a physical day-planner or opt for a scheduling app on their phone. Also prioritize the items on your 'to-do list', things will be much easier. Categorize your tasks in order of importance and urgency. Complete the most important and urgent chores first, then work your way down to the least important and urgent. Be vigilant about activities that waste your time. This is not to say that you should not do activities you enjoy. Instead, do these things during scheduled break times and set a strict time limit on how long you will do them.

Outcome: It was highly informative and motivational session. The total of 250 students were enrolled for the session and all 100% were highly satisfied and ready to follow the scheduled pattern for their medical education study. The pre and post test score showed statistically significant difference indicate program was noteworthy for students.

Feedback & analysis: There were a total of 10 questions prepared by experts for feedback analysis on session contents. Pretest and post test score was 2.6 and 9.0 respectively with significant difference as indicated by $p = 0.0001$.

Content delivered:

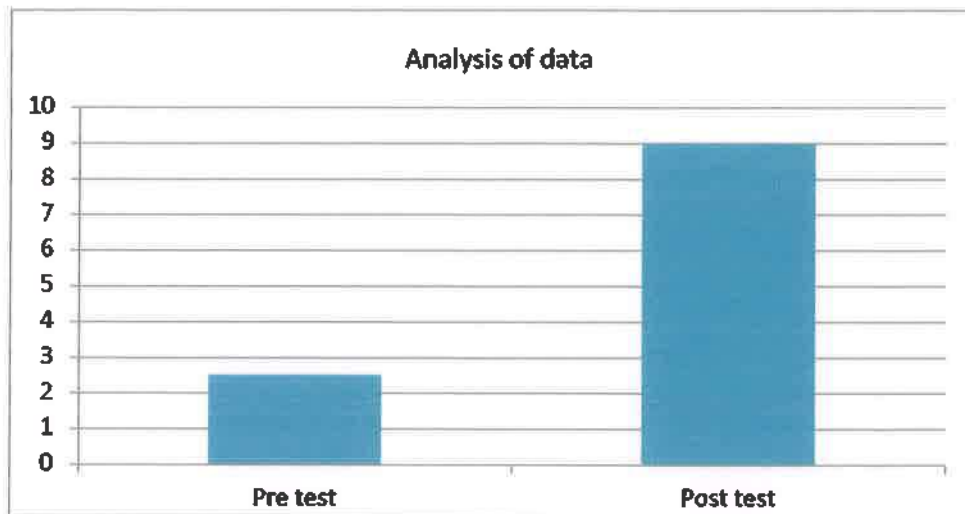
Effective time management is a crucial skill that future physicians must master, given the time-consuming nature of medical education. Without a plan to balance attending classes, studying, and everyday activities, medical students can easily become overworked, frustrated, and stressed. However, by developing time management skills, they can greatly improve their quality of life. During a Soft Skill Development Program session led by Dr. Anuradha Totey, the speaker emphasized the importance of a centralized location for a time study schedule. This could be a physical day-planner or a scheduling app on a phone. Prioritizing tasks on a to-do list can also make things easier. Categorizing tasks based on their importance and urgency can help students complete the most important and urgent chores first before working their way down to the least important and urgent. It is important to be mindful of activities that waste time, but this does not mean students should avoid enjoyable activities altogether. Instead, these activities should be done during scheduled break times with a strict time limit.

Outcome: The outcome of the session was extremely positive, with participants finding it both informative and motivational. A total of 227 students attended the session, and 100% of them reported high satisfaction levels and a willingness to follow the scheduled pattern for their medical education studies. The pre-test and post-test scores showed a statistically significant difference, indicating that the program was particularly beneficial for students.

Feedback & analysis: To analyze feedback on the session contents, experts prepared a total of 10 questions. The pre-test and post-test scores were 3.8 and 9.4, respectively, with a significant difference indicated by a p-value of 0.0001.

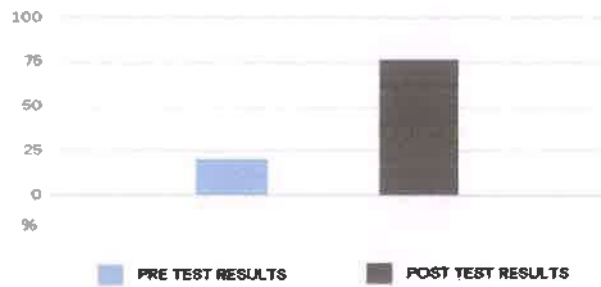
- On the 27th June, 2022, Krishna College of physiotherapy had arranged a seminar on "Soft Skill Development-Identification of research skills in UG students"

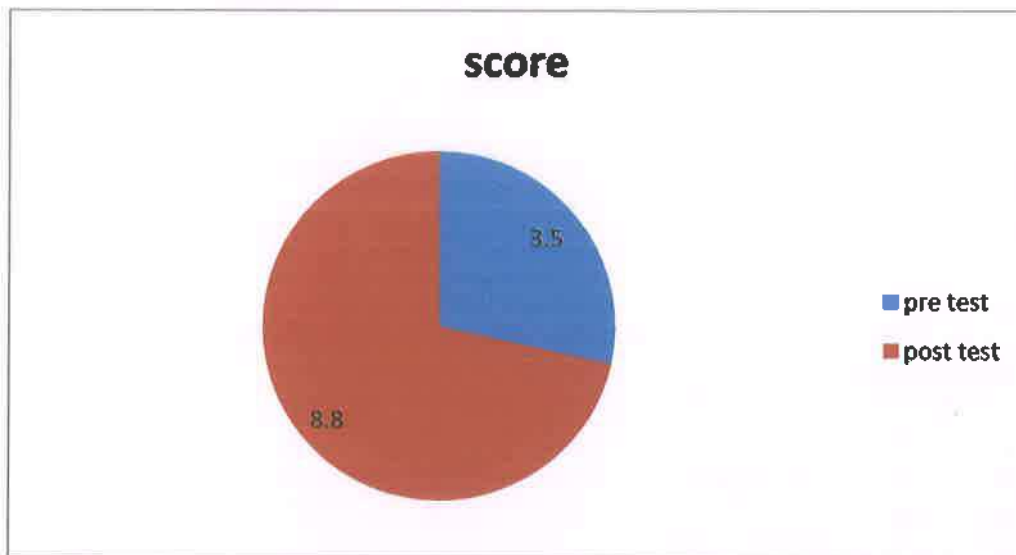

After the lunch break the ergonomic modifications for correct postures and ideal dental layout was discussed. Practical tips and tricks for chairside stretching were practiced by the staff members.

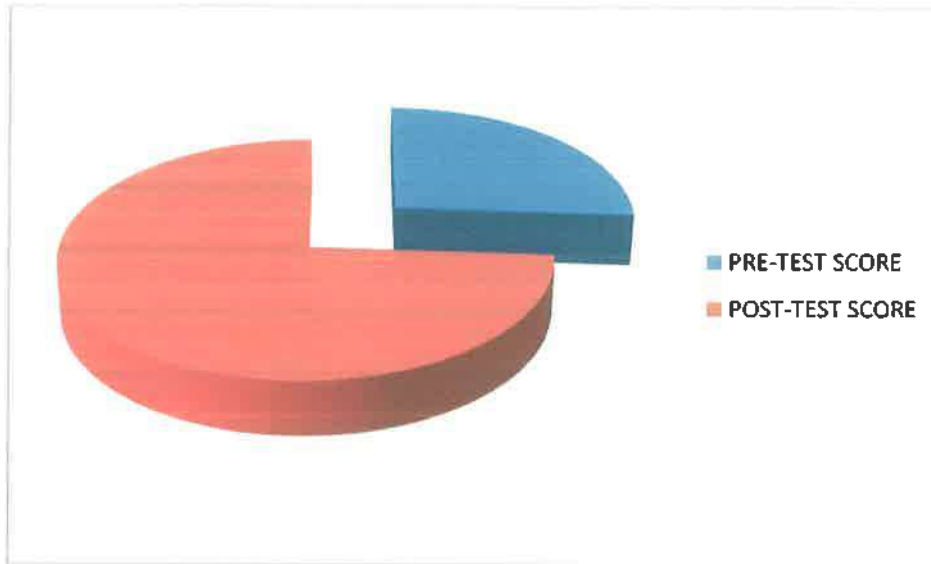
This was followed by a question answer session where the audience participated enthusiastically in getting their doubts cleared on the different problems faced especially in the post pandemic phase of increased online work.

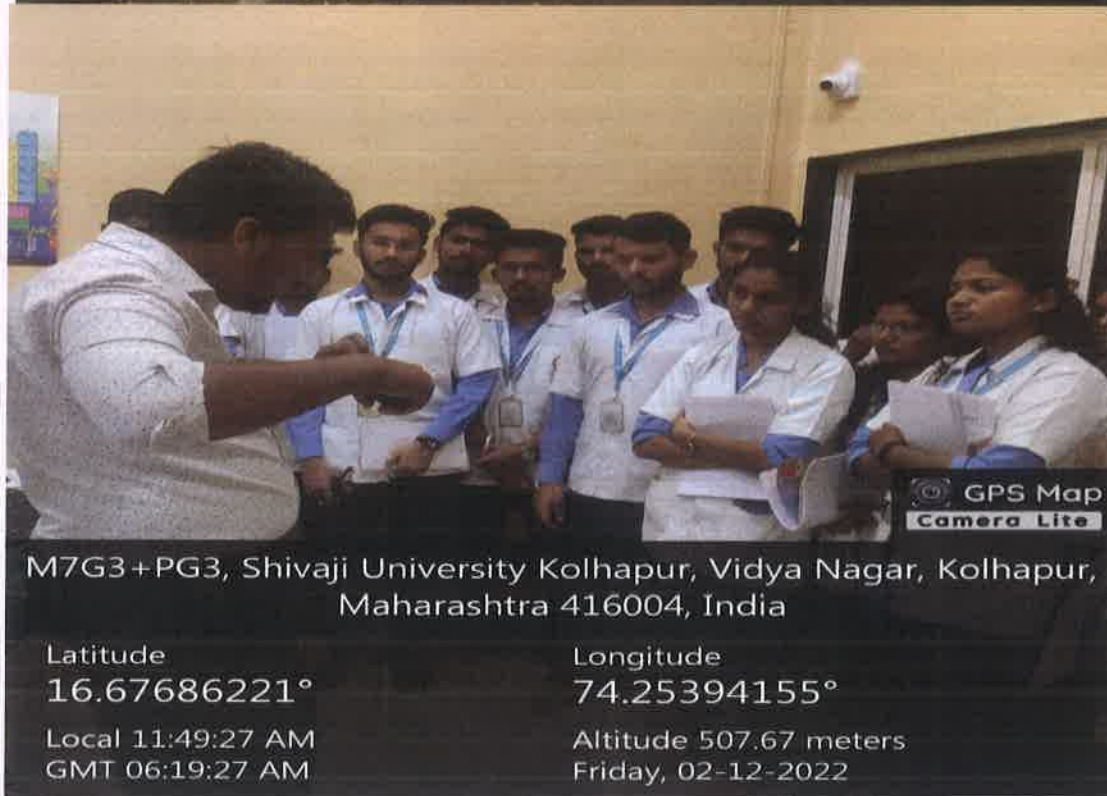

In afternoon session some warning letters issued by USFDA were discussed with corrective action and preventive action plan.

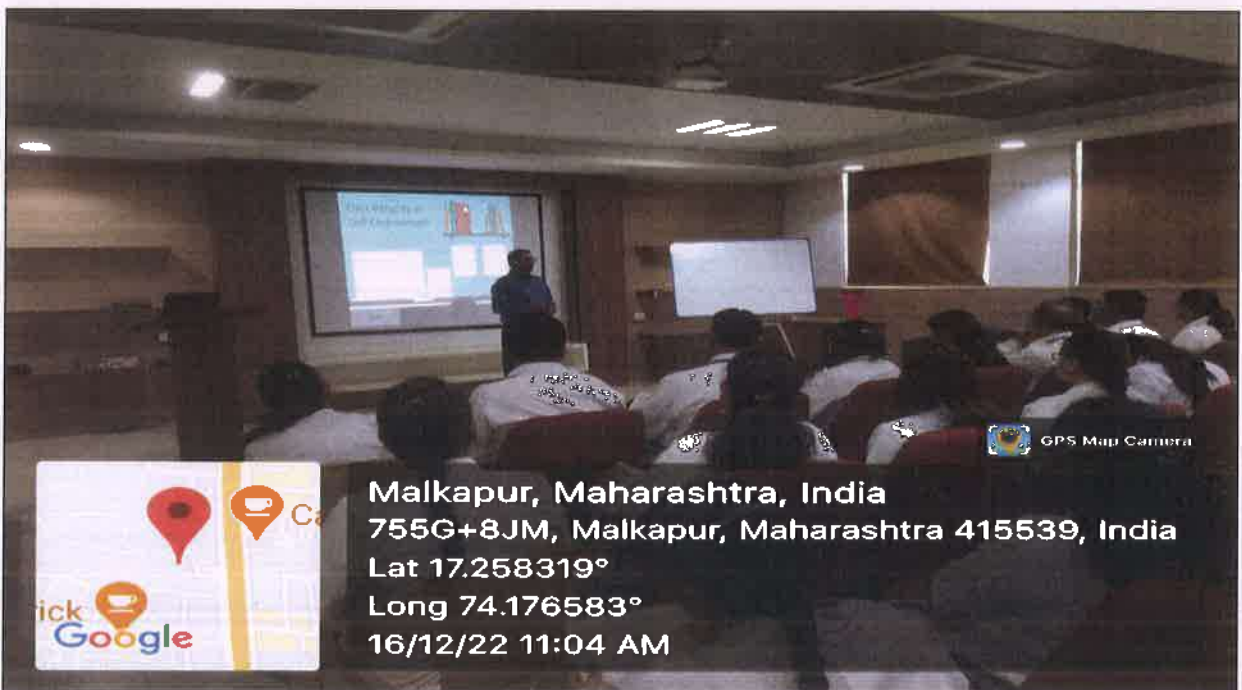

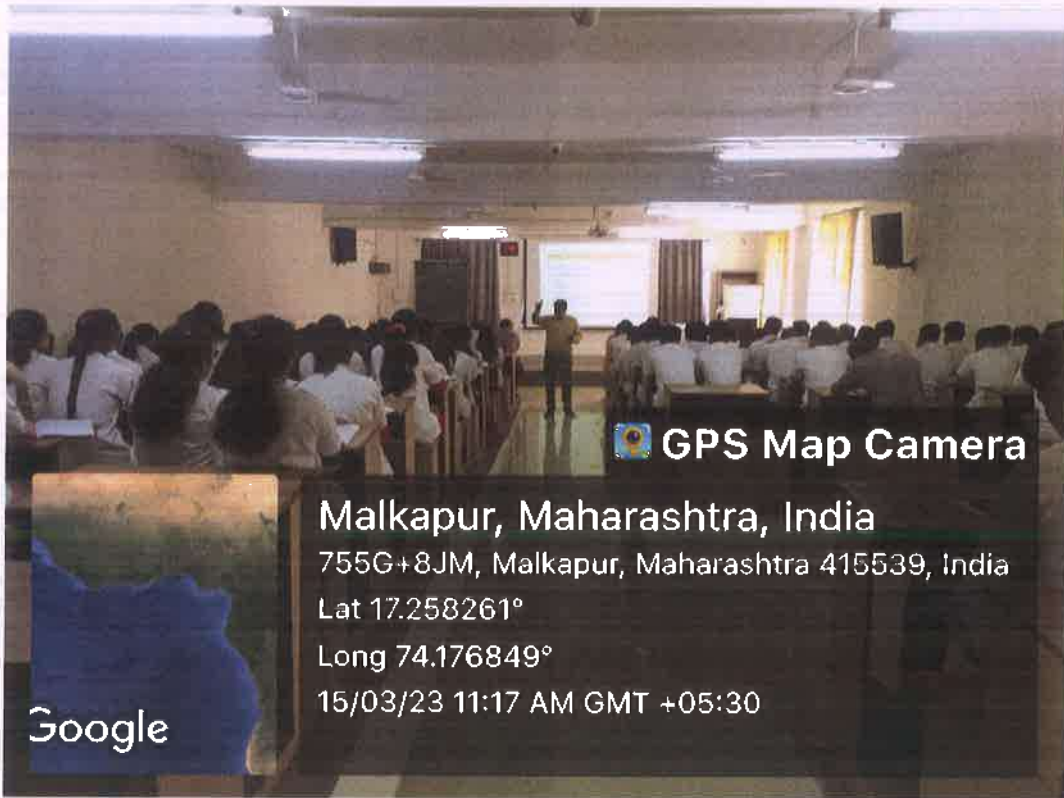

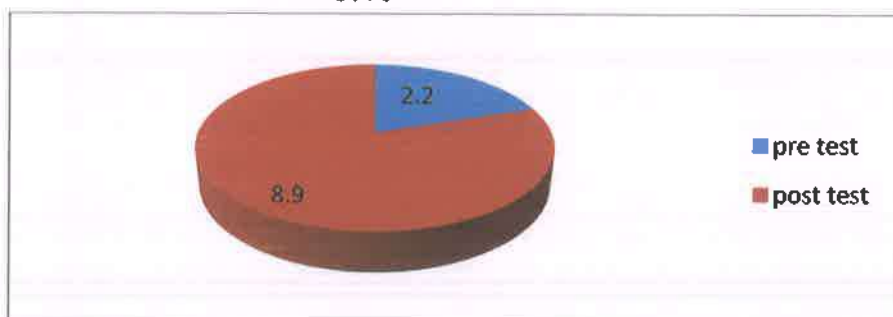

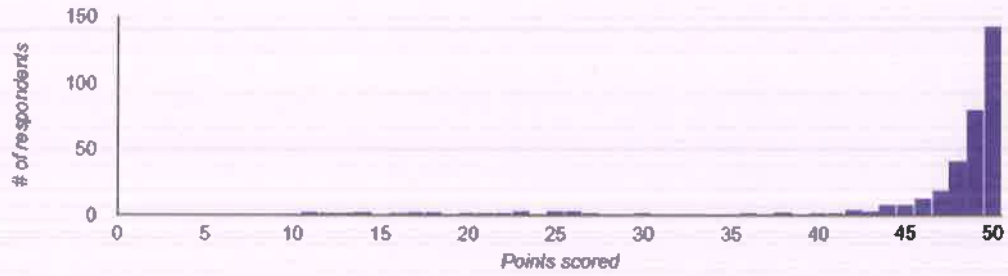

Pre and Post- test were conducted while conducting the programme for outcome analysis .

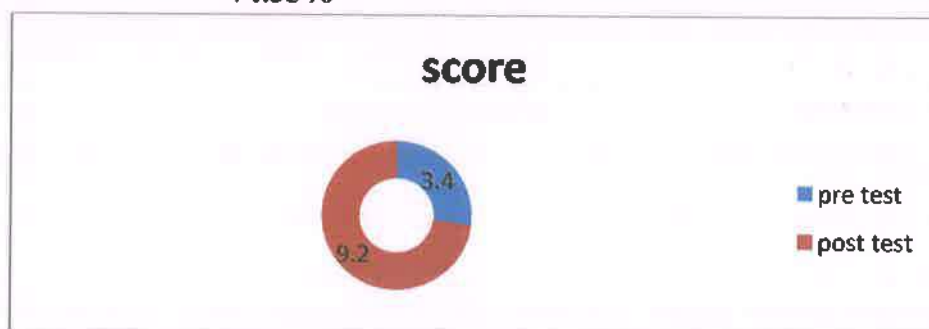
